

## Frequently Answered Questions

### **When does Victory Kids happen?**

Victory Kids runs concurrent with all Victory Church services - 10am and 6pm on Sundays. We also run a fun holiday program known as KIDGO, which occurs during every school holiday period. See the KIDGO link for more details.

### **Do I need to provide a snack?**

Yes, we do ask that parents provide a healthy, allergy-free snack (such as fruit) as we provide a time within our program where the children will sit and eat their snacks.

### **What age groups do you cater for?**

Victory Kids runs programs for all children from 0 years to year 7. See the VK Worlds link for more details.

### **What provision is there for my child with special needs?**

We are committed to connecting every child into our activities. For this reason, we have a dedicated team of both skilled and dedicated people, who cater for a variety of needs including hearing impairment, Asperger's Syndrome, and food allergies. ### **Can I stay with my child in the Victory Kids program?**

Parents are always welcome to stay with their child if that is what they wish. However, for safety reasons, you will need to clear this with either the Early Childhood or Primary Coordinator, who will provide you with a Visitor Pass. A VK leader will be able to point you in the right direction.

### **Do I need to be on a volunteer roster?**

This is not a requirement, however if you would like to help out, please visit our VK Leaders link and then talk to one of our leaders.

### **Will my children go into the main auditorium for praise and worship?**

Yes, we take primary-school aged children into the main service for praise and worship at both morning and night services, and also at other times. Our early childhood children (aged 2 – 5) have their own special praise and worship in the small auditorium during this time.

### **What sort of screening do you do with your leaders?**

We consider the safety of our children with the upmost importance. All leaders have their references consulted to ensure they are suitable to be working with children. They are required to obtain a National Police Criminal History Clearance and also undergo a Child-Safe Environments training course. Our leaders also receive ongoing training in relation to safety procedures concerning children.
