

Parents Information

On behalf of the Victory Kids team we welcome you to Victory Kids, and thank you for entrusting your child to our care during the Sunday services! That is why we are serious about designing a program that is relevant, safe and considerate of your child's needs.

Curriculum

We write and develop our own curriculum, which uses biblical stories and situations to explore various topics aimed both at building a child's character and relationship with God. This interactive curriculum utilises multimedia to connect with children in a relevant, fun and engaging way.

Victory Kids Team

We are extremely proud of our Victory Kids team. They not only undergo a National Police Criminal History Clearance and complete a Child-Safe Environments course, but are also screened for appropriateness to work with children. Once becoming a VK leader, they attend regular training and envisioning times. Our team also attend conferences and training days, both locally and interstate. They are a dedicated and enthusiastic team, so please thank them and encourage them for the awesome job that they do.

Registration Procedures

We can help you register your child at Victory Kids at our new registrations area and we will be more than happy to help you with the registration form. Upon registering, you will be given a numbered card and if we need to contact you during the church service, your number will be displayed on the screen in the main auditorium. Please present and return your numbered card to a VK leader in your child's room, when picking them up.

Signing In/Out

On arrival to your child's room, you will be asked to sign in your child, and a name badge will be given to them. You will need to sign them out at the conclusion of the main service. This assists us to recognise who is responsible for a child at any given time.

Child Protection

Victory Kids regards the protection of children in our care with utmost importance. All leaders obtain a National Police Criminal History Clearance, undertake a Child-Safe Environments training course and have the recommendation from a member of the Victory Church Leadership. No leader is permitted to be alone with a child (there must always be at least two leaders present). Adult visitors attending any of the activities are given a visitor badge, once cleared by a VK Coordinator, so that they are easily identifiable to leaders, parents and children.

Special Needs

Victory Kids is committed to connecting every child into our activities. For this reason, we have a dedicated team of both skilled and dedicated people, who cater for a variety of needs including hearing impairment, Asperger's Syndrome, and food allergies. Our Special Needs Coordinator is Jane Mangos, who has regular employment and qualifications in this field. In addition to Jane, we have trained teachers, psychologists, nurses and even a paediatrician, who all provide much valued skills and advice.

Discipline

We try to make our programs fun, fresh and powerful so that a child will not become disruptive. We also use positive reinforcement and team competitions where points are awarded to children who are making great choices regarding their behaviour. We have a step process to manage misbehaviour, which focuses upon guiding the child to recognise, own and redirect misbehaviour. In extreme circumstances a child may be placed back into the adult service with their parent. Parents will be notified of any inappropriate behaviour.

Kids Involvement in Ministry

We encourage children to begin to explore their God-given gifts by providing opportunities for them to serve others, such as dance, singing, prayer, multimedia, hosting, peer support etc. We encourage you to discuss your child's potential involvement with one of our VK leaders.
